5 Chairman's Report

Christine gave an excellent report on the Group's activities over the last 12 months and on what lies ahead for the group. Walks

Since the last AGM the group has been out on 12 Wednesday walks, 11 Sunday walks and 11 Thursday walks including a Christmas lunch walk last December and another lunch walk in January of this year. The lynch pin of this walking programme is John Bater who finds leaders for all these walks and who also organises guides for Thursdays and Sundays. A very special thank you to John. Also we have had 9 Tuesday walks, these are shorter and easier than other walks and have proved very popular. David Cadet and Norman Pearson have organised and lead all of these, their efforts are much appreciated. In addition we had a day trip to Hebden Bridge with the Hearing Impaired Group, Unfortunately there was an incident on the towpath and Ken fell, please lets not let that happen again.

If we add it all up this is again not far short of 300 miles. All of this has been reported in the newsletters thanks to Gail. Safety on Walks

I want to take this opportunity to say a word or two about safety on walks. We must not let the walking group get too strung out as we risk losing people or we may not be aware of an incident that may have occurred. Leaders set the pace to suit the group as a whole and no one should walk in front of the leader. We must pause at stiles and tops of hills etc to allow walkers to catch up. The back marker should not hesitate to use the radio to ask the leader to wait.

Dogs on Walks

This is about safety, we now regularly have Willow, Barley, Charlie and Holly on walks and it is also possible to have Hattie and Toby as well. There has been some concern about dogs running up and down the line, knocking into people's legs and potentially knocking people over. We will always try to have some free running for the dogs but this is not always possible especially where there is livestock in the fields or where the path is narrow.
